Preschool Ministry Medical Procedures

A child who appears ill or has been ill in the preceding 24 hours cannot be accepted into a classroom. If your child displays any of the following symptoms, please do not bring them to the preschool area.

- Fever within the previous 24 hours
- Vomiting and/or diarrhea
- Any symptoms of the usual childhood diseases:
 - Scarlet Fever
 - German Measles
 - Mumps
 - Chicken Pox
 - Whooping Cough
- Common cold and flu (from onset through one week)
- Sore throat
- Croup
- Any unexplained rash
- Thrush
- Any skin infection: boils, ringworm, impetigo
- Pink eye and other eye infections
- Head lice

If your child becomes ill during a church activity, you will be contacted to pick the child up immediately. Please be sure to confirm or provide a good contact number upon signing in your child, in the case we need to contact you.

Mission Statement

Our Preschool Ministry exists to help preschoolers discover the love of God by worshipping Him, learning about His Word, giving to others, and sharing His love.



Safety Policies

1. Anyone who works with your child has been a member of Bear Creek for at least 3 months, has been attending for a minimum of 6 months and has had a legal background check completed and approved.
2. There are always two workers who are not related to each other present at all times in every room.
3. In the preschool area, diapers are changed only in designated areas and in the presence of other caregivers. Male workers do not change diapers or take children to the bathroom.
4. A female adult worker accompanies all children, two years old through grade three, to the bathroom. We always make sure the restroom is clear before allowing a child to enter.
5. If a child needs assistance while in the restroom, the female adult worker leaves the door open.
6. For safety purposes, we do not permit people to wander around the preschool hallways. If you need help, please ask anyone at the Preschool Welcome Desk to assist you.
7. You will print a set of stickers with corresponding numbers. Your child's first and last name will be printed on all security tags. You place one on the child and keep the corresponding tag. In order to pick up your child, you must return the sticker with the corresponding number. If the sticker is misplaced, your pin number. You will be sent to the Preschool Welcome Desk to verify your identity with a four digit security code. This security system is used every time a child is in the care of our Preschool/Children's Ministry.
- 8. If we should need you while you are in service, that security number will be posted on the large screens in the worship center. Please come to the preschool desk if you see your child's security number on the screen.**
9. To ensure security, only children and adult workers should be inside the classroom. Please knock on the door and wait for the teacher to check the nametag number and release your child.
The only exception to this are parents who have checked in at the visitor desk and have a yellow badge. If you have received your yellow badge, you are ONLY allowed to engage your child.
9. All workers wear nametags while working in the Preschool Ministry areas. If you as a parent notice anyone without a tag, please let us know as soon as possible.
10. If for any reason the preschool area must be evacuated, children cannot be released during the process of evacuation. You may walk with your child's class; however, your child will not be released until arriving at the designated location and given instructions from the Preschool Director/Pastor. This is to ensure every child is accounted for and safe.

Threes & Fours

The phase when anything can be imagined, everything can be a game, and one curious preschooler wants to know "WHY?"

Physically

- Balances on one foot for 5-10 seconds
- Strings beads
- Cuts with scissors
- Rides a tricycle
- Walks upstairs with alternating feet
- Buttons and unbuttons clothes

Verbally

- Increasingly easier to understand
- May struggle with some sounds: r, l, s, z, j, sh, ch, th
- Says over 1,000 words (but who's really counting anymore)
- Answers "what", "where", and "when" questions

Mentally

- Beginning to distinguish "real" from "not real"
- May struggle to understand "truth" vs. "lie".
- Still unable to take the point of view of others
- Lives in the present; limited memory of past events
- Learns by putting things into simple categories
- Beginnings to identify cause and effect

Emotionally

- May bite, scream, and throw tantrums (3 years)
- Enjoys both physical humor and simple jokes
- Can express basic emotions when asked
- Can tell you what makes them happy or sad
- May have nightmares or specific fears (fire, dark, monsters)
- Responds to story-telling as a way to talk about feelings

Your role is to embrace their physical needs

- Thinks like an artist – You can help them learn when you...engage their senses.
- Wants to know, "AM I OKAY?"...You capture their hearts when you...cultivate their self-control.
- Is motivated by safety – You coach their moral abilities when you...discipline consistently.

Curriculum



In the Preschool Ministry, we are excited to be using the Orange Curriculum called First Look. We have gathered key servant leaders to build a Christian foundation in the lives of preschoolers who will learn that God made them, God loves them, and Jesus wants to be their friend forever.

The curriculum is age appropriate, starting with the most basic truths through lullaby songs for the babies, moving up to more complex lessons and activities to "make it fun, make it true and make it stick". All of the age levels have the common goal of teaching preschoolers basic truths that will remain with them for the rest of their lives

First Look provides materials that help parents take steps to engage in the spiritual development of their preschoolers. These materials and resources help parents connect First Look's monthly Bottom Line with an everyday faith at home. We strongly encourage you to take advantage of the materials provided to you and to equip you to be spiritual leaders in your homes.

First Look Parent Cue provides multiple communication pieces as tools for partnering with parents. These include:

- Parent Time- a monthly piece for parents of children younger than two
- Small Talk- a monthly and/or weekly piece that provides an overview of the month or week
- At-home activity and Parent Cue Cards (memory verse cards).

Developmental Stages of Preschoolers

It is important to understand the developmental stages of preschoolers in order to best meet their needs. The following information is provided as a resource for you.

Babies and Toddlers – Zero to One

The Phase when nobody sleeps, everybody smells, and one mesmerizing baby convinces you “I NEED YOU NOW”!

Physically

- Lifts their head and chest (3-4 months)
- Reaches for objects and rolls over (4-6 months)
- Sits up and grabs with two fingers (6-8 months)
- Crawls (6-10 months)
- Stands unsupported/maybe even walks (11-12 months)

Verbally

- Has distinctive cries and makes vowel sounds (0-6 months)
- Turns toward your voice and makes consonant sounds (3 months)
- Mimics your tone and “babbling” (6 months)
- Understands simple words (9 months)
- Understands around 70 words and says “first words” (12 months)

Mentally

- Experiences the world through five senses
- Mildly aware of everything and learning fast
- Learns best from things that respond to them (people over screens)
- Enjoys music, dramatic expressions, silly voices, and things that make you look ridiculous.

Emotionally

- Gives the first social smile (6 weeks)
- Mirrors expressions (2 months)
- Distinguishes happy faces from sad faces (4 months)
- Turns away from strangers to show fear (6 months)
- Shows surprise at loud noises (7 months)

Ones & Twos

The Phase when nobody’s on time, everything is a mess, and one eager toddler will insist, “I CAN DO IT”!

Physically

- Sits, crawls, and walks (12-15 months)
- Walks backwards and sideways (15-18 months)
- Scribbles with crayons (15-18 months)
- Walks up and down stairs, jumps in place (18-24 months)
- Throws a ball overhead, briefly stands on one foot, and may demonstrate hand preferences (24-36 months)

Verbally

- Points to objects when you name them (18 months)
- Says 10-20 words, mostly nouns and pronouns (18 months)
- Says 40-50 words and forms two word sentences (24 months)
- Says 300-400 words that may be difficult to understand (36 months)
- Still understands more than they can communicate

Mentally

- Follows simple instructions
- Benefits from repetition
- Unable to take the point of view of other people
- Doesn’t comprehend time; often confuses past, present, and future
- Learning is enhanced through music, movement, and art

Emotionally

- Enjoys role-play activities
- Has trouble sharing and displays separation anxiety
- May begin to bite, scream, and throw tantrums
- Plays next to, rather than with, playmates
- Recognizes basic emotions in others

Your role is to embrace their physical needs
